Anderson Animal Shelter does not receive any government funding and truly relies on the support of the community to continue to operate.

Kindergarten Registration – Kindergarten registration will take place at all the elementary schools on February 1st. Corron's hours of registration are from 9:30 – 2:30. If your student will be five years old by September 1st, and Corron is your home school, please be sure to register. New this year, residency and enrollment information will be available ahead of time so you can fill out the paperwork in the comfort of your home. Please go to the District 303 website and print off the required Kindergarten Registration papers. Please refer to the attached flyer for all the information required for registration.

Per state law, a child must be five (5) years old on or before September 1, 2017 to be eligible to attend Kindergarten during the 2017-2018 school year. Reliable proof of a child's identity and age (birth certificate, passport, visa, etc.) will be required at the time of registration as will verification of the identity of the parent or guardian. Families must provide two (2) documents as proof of residency when enrolling children. New student residency and enrollment information, including links to required notices and Kindergarten enrollment forms, can be found on the District 303 website district.d303.org/enrollment-and-registration. **For Corron Parents, please go to the Corron website and complete the Kindergarten Parent Survey on line.**

Parents have the option of an All Day Kindergarten (ADK) or Half Day Kindergarten program. All Day Kindergarten is a tuition-based program. Information regarding All Day Kindergarten tuition for the 2017-2018 school year will be available before February 1, pending Board of Education approval.
